2012 Driver Education Class

District OR1 is offering a Driver Education Class at Palmyra High School. Classroom instruction will begin Monday, June 4 and continue through Friday June 8 from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Students who successfully complete this class will receive a Provisional Operators Permit (POP) Waiver. This Waiver eliminates the written and drive test from the Department of Motor Vehicle in Lincoln.

The Provisional Operators Permit Drivers License will be issued when the individual turns 16 and has held a Learners Permit (Type LPD) for 6 months. The individual must also provide 2 different proof of address to the DMV. Reminder, minimum age for the LPD Permit is 15.

Requirements: Individual must be 14 years by June 1, 100% attendance, 20 hours of classroom instruction, 5 hours practical driving (driving times and dates made during class time), written state exam, and a final driving exam.

Enrollment begins now. Complete the form below and return the bottom portion to Mr. Wergin at Palmyra High School with **the required enrollment fee**. Cost of the class is **\$200 payable to Palmyra High School**.
