Recycle and Reuse old Medicine Bottles

Silver Creek 4-H Club will be collecting empty plastic medicine bottles to be recycled or sent to developing countries.

Beginning May 24th, there will be receptacles for the pill bottles at the following locations:

Decker's Food Center - Palmyra

Village Office - Palmyra

Village Office - Bennet

Any prescription or over-the-counter plastic pill bottle will be accepted. Please rinse the bottle and remove the label.

By donating your old pill bottles, you will be reducing the amount of plastic in landfills and helping medical conditions in poor parts of the world.

Pill Bottle Donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. Our pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

Acceptable collection items include:

- Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill Bottles with and without secure caps (child-resistant)

Pill bottles that are not appropriate to include with shipments of medical supplies are recycled and may generate revenue that supports Matthew 25: Ministries' programs. If you wish to prepare bottles for shipment rather than recycling, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.
- Sort bottles by color and type.
- Remove labels, leaving no glue or residue.
- Wash bottles in very hot water and dish soap.
- Rinse and dry thoroughly.
- Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.
- Place clean, recapped bottles in large ziplock bags marked "Clean Bottles." These will be blended with medical supplies.

RESCUING EXCESS PLASTIC FROM LANDFILLS

In developing countries, medicines are often dispensed into hands, leaves or any other available containers.

Recycling only a portion of the millions of plastic prescription vials, stock bottles, and liquids bottles that are used by pharmacies each month results in significant energy conservation and greenhouse gas savings.

Help improve the quality of our environment and health care in hospitals and health clinics in developing countries by saving and donating basic medical supplies such as pill bottles.

PILL BOTTLE DONATIONS

Donations of empty plastic pill bottles serve two purposes:

- Helping the poorest of the poor by providing a way to distribute medicine in capped, unlabeled, and sterilized containers.
- Keeping thousands of bottles out of landfills each year.

PILL BOTTLE DONATION GUIDELINES

- It is your responsibility to ensure the privacy of your medical information by removing labels prior to donating your empty pill bottles.
- We prefer pill bottles without medical labels and ones that have been thoroughly rinsed.
- Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill bottles with/without child-resistant caps
- Pill bottles donated by individuals, small groups and organizations may be blended together with other medical items and packaged onto pallets for shipment.
