



UNL Extension 7th Grade Leader Summit

The 7th grade experienced at UNL Extension Leadership Summit on Wednesday, January 26th. The students gathered in the west gym and heard about various leaders in our country and community. Taking a personality assessment, students then focused on the various traits of

successful leaders. Prior to lunch, the student had to define for themselves the traits of a successful leader. In the afternoon, several creative and interactive activities, trying to get a tennis ball into a plastic cup, using popsicle sticks in a listening exercise, and building a tower with pvc pipe and joints, exposed students to active leadership opportunities.

The Leadership Summit is but one of several school engagement programs offered by the UNL Extension service.

Most of the matches have been able to be in person, masks required at Bennet Elementary and recommended at Palmyra High School. Susan T. Buffett Scholarship

The Susan T. Buffett Foundation has offered scholarships to college students in Nebraska for over 50 years. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to first-time freshman entering college who live in Nebraska, graduate from a Nebraska high school (or GED) with plans to attend a Nebraska public college, and demonstrate financial need. There are a limited number of scholarships, so the Foundation is unable to provide awards to all eligible candidates. For more info go to: <https://buffettscholarships.org/>



To be eligible for the Susan T. Buffett scholarship, you must:

- Live in Nebraska and meet in-state residency requirements of the college you plan to attend
 - DACA, undocumented, or DACA eligible students are still eligible to apply
 - For questions about your residency status, here is a **[list of contact numbers](#)**
- Graduate from a Nebraska high school or earn a Nebraska GED
- Achieve at least a 2.0 cumulative unweighted GPA in high school
 - 2.0 on a 4 point scale
 - 77 on a 100 point scale
- Be a first-time freshman when entering college

- Students obtaining dual enrollment credits in high school are still eligible to apply
- Plan to attend a Nebraska public college:
 - **NE Community Colleges** - CCC, LPTC, MCC, MPCC, NECC, NICC, SCC, or WNCC;
 - **NE State College System** - Chadron State, Peru State, Wayne State; or
 - **University of NE System** - NCTA, UNK, UNL, UNMC, or UNO
- Be in need of financial assistance in order to attend college
 - **Note:** You do not need to be Pell Grant eligible to qualify
 - You must have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) below \$10,000

All eligible applications are reviewed and scored. Selection is based on:

- Financial need
- Academic merit
- Personal essay
- Recommendation




