#### **David City Covid Procedures for Athletic Events**

#### **David City High School Gym**

Using the current DHM mandates and NSAA guidelines where available, which we anticipate being in place for the foreseeable future. Hand sanitizing stations will be provided and masks are required.

#### **Entrance and Exit Strategies**

- Home Fans will enter through the Activity Entrance West Doors.
- Visiting Fans will park North of the gym, East of the high school and enter in the East Activity doors.
- Handicapped will park and enter thru the Activity Entrance East Doors.

#### Gym Capacity/Occupancy

- 25% Capacity per the NSAA Return to Activities Guidelines, Phase II, so we
  have a limit of 600 in our gym at one time. We are limiting the athletes to 4
  spectators per athlete.
- Maintain 6' distancing between family groups and every other row.
- David City fans will sit on the north side of the gym and visiting fans will sit on the south side of the gym.
- SNC passes will be honored.

#### Concessions

- The concession stand will be located in the Activities Center with Visitors using the East Side and Home using the West.
- All concessions workers will wear gloves and masks
- Concessions workers will have assigned duties (ie popcorn, money handler)
- No community condiments. Workers will dispense the condiments.
- Concession stands will be limited to bottled drinks, popcorn, candy, hotdogs and nachos (chips are prepackaged).

#### Restrooms

Restrooms located in the Activity Center.

#### **Students**

- No Pep Band will play.
- DC Student section will be located on the stage no alumni allowed.

No spectators will be allowed on the floor before or after games. Athletes will not be permitted to come out of the locker room and talk with parents after the game.

## Message From Superintendent Mr. Hart

Kindergarten classes will be canceled for Friday, December 18th, Monday, December 21st, and Tuesday, December 22nd. Please note: We are concerned about this week's increase in transmission in kindergarten and this is the reason for the change in schedule. Thank you in advance for your understanding.

Elementary and High School students will have school on Monday, December 21st (to finish end of the semester assessments), but classes for grades 1-12 will be canceled for Tuesday, December 22nd. Staff will still report on Tuesday, December 22nd to assist with preparation for second-semester cleaning and PPE resupply.

Although I know these changes may create some possible scheduling hardships for families, we believe that this proactive measure is the best way to safely end the first semester. #### Susan T. Buffett Scholarship

The Susan T. Buffett Foundation has offered scholarships to college students in Nebraska for over 50 years. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to first-time freshman entering college who live in Nebraska, graduate from a Nebraska high school (or GED) with plans to attend a Nebraska public college, and demonstrate financial need. There are a limited number of scholarships, so the Foundation is unable to provide awards to all eligible candidates. For more info go to: https://buffettscholarships.org/



#### To be eligible for the Susan T. Buffett scholarship, you must:

- Live in Nebraska and meet in-state residency requirements of the college you plan to attend
  - DACA, undocumented, or DACA eligible students are still eligible to apply
  - For questions about your residency status, here is a <u>list of</u> <u>contact numbers</u>
- Graduate from a Nebraska high school or earn a Nebraska GED
- Achieve at least a 2.0 cumulative unweighted GPA in high school
  - 2.0 on a 4 point scale
  - 77 on a 100 point scale
- Be a first-time freshman when entering college
  - Students obtaining dual enrollment credits in high school are still eligible to apply
- Plan to attend a Nebraska public college:
  - NE Community Colleges CCC, LPTC, MCC, MPCC, NECC, NICC, SCC, or WNCC;
  - NE State College System Chadron State, Peru State, Wayne State; or
  - University of NE System NCTA, UNK, UNL, UNMC, or UNO

- Be in need of financial assistance in order to attend college
  - **Note:** You do not need to be Pell Grant eligible to qualify
  - You must have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) below \$10,000

All eligible applications are reviewed and scored. Selection is based on:

- Financial need
- Academic merit
- Personal essay
- Recommendation

- 3. **Apply to your top college choices**. To find a college application checklist and other helpful resources go to EducationQuest.org
- 4. **Create a Federal Student Aid account at <u>studentaid.gov</u>** (both you and a parent will need an account). This is the site you will use to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- 5. **Complete the FAFSA at <u>studentaid.gov</u>**. The FAFSA is your application for federal, state, and college-based financial aid.


