



School Closing Due to Inclement Weather

Each winter we have school days when we are faced with the dilemma as to whether school will start on time, start late, or should be canceled altogether. This decision is never easy to make, but we want you to know that we have our students' safety foremost in mind. With that said, be aware that we will monitor road conditions closely and will use that information to make the determination about a school closing or late start. We will check roads beginning at 4:30 AM so that we can arrive at a decision by 6:15 AM. If a decision is made to close school or to have a late start, we will notify families via the District School notification system and KFOR radio 1240 AM. These are the primary contacts with late start or closing information. In addition, we will notify channel 10-11 television for the Lincoln market and Channel 6 television in the Omaha market. Our website and Twitter feed will be updated as quickly as we can in order to get information out in a timely fashion.

I would remind you to update your contact information with the school. This includes your email, home phone and mobile phone information. If our information is incorrect or missing, we will be unable to contact you via the District Notification System in case of a weather closure.

*In case of inclement weather: If District OR 1 were to have a late start, the school day would begin at 10:00 AM and buses would run one hour and forty-five minutes later than the original pick up time.




Juniors will take the ACT on Tuesday, April 5, 2022

All PHS juniors will take the State Mandated ACT on Tuesday, April 5. In order to be prepared and do their very best, all juniors have access to the On To College curriculum by John Baylor. The video and game based instruction is available 24/7 for students. However, starting on Thursday, January 6, 2022, they are also placed in special classes every week during 8 to Great time to view a video and have questions answered. Susan T. Buffett Scholarship

The Susan T. Buffett Foundation has offered scholarships to college students in Nebraska for over 50 years. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to first-time freshman entering college who live in Nebraska, graduate from a Nebraska high school (or GED) with plans to attend a Nebraska public college, and demonstrate financial need. There are a limited number of scholarships, so the Foundation is unable to provide awards to all eligible candidates. For more info go to: https://buffettscholarships.org/



To be eligible for the Susan T. Buffett scholarship, you must:

- Live in Nebraska and meet in-state residency requirements of the college you plan to attend
 - DACA, undocumented, or DACA eligible students are still eligible to apply
 - For questions about your residency status, here is a <u>list of</u> <u>contact numbers</u>
- Graduate from a Nebraska high school or earn a Nebraska GED
- Achieve at least a 2.0 cumulative unweighted GPA in high school
 - o 2.0 on a 4 point scale
 - o 77 on a 100 point scale
- Be a first-time freshman when entering college
 - Students obtaining dual enrollment credits in high school are still eligible to apply
- Plan to attend a Nebraska public college:

- NE Community Colleges CCC, LPTC, MCC, MPCC, NECC, NICC, SCC, or WNCC;
- NE State College System Chadron State, Peru State, Wayne State; or
- University of NE System NCTA, UNK, UNL, UNMC, or UNO
- Be in need of financial assistance in order to attend college
 - o **Note:** You do not need to be Pell Grant eligible to qualify
 - You must have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) below \$10,000

All eligible applications are reviewed and scored. Selection is based on:

- Financial need
- Academic merit
- Personal essay
- Recommendation
