Mead Public Schools Fall Sports Attendance Plans As of 8/20/20

This is the current plan for hosting volleyball and football games at Mead Public Schools. We feel this is an appropriate plan based on current information. PLEASE NOTE: These plans may be altered at any time due to updated information or changing circumstances. We appreciate your cooperation as we try to provide an environment that will allow our athletes to complete their athletic seasons.

Volleyball

- All spectators will be required to wear a mask upon entering the building.
- Coaches and event staff, with the possible exception of game officials, will be required to wear a mask.
- Social distancing in the bleachers is expected, and households should sit together when possible.
- Games should be available via livestream.
 - Search YouTube for 'Mead Public Schools' or use this link.
- Home and Visitor sides have been swapped from previous years.
- Additional space will be marked off around team benches, behind the scorer's table, and the front row.
- Teams will not switch benches.
- The stage will be reserved for
 - The waiting team during triangulars.
 - Mead students during duals.
 - Closed during JH.
- Admission payments in exact amounts are preferred to eliminate the need to provide change.
- Concessions items will be limited to individually packaged items such as pop and candy that can be consumed without completely removing a mask.
- Students and children will be expected to remain seated as much as possible. Repeated trips to the Commons for concessions will be discouraged.
- Tables in the Commons will be unavailable to spectators.
- Visiting cheerleaders and bands are not allowed.
- Players will proceed directly to locker rooms or designated areas after games are completed.
- If necessary, attendance may be limited if occupancy recommendations are exceeded.

Football

- Masks are highly recommended for all spectators and required in bleachers, in the restrooms, and in line for concessions.
- There will be porta-johns available to alleviate some crowding at restrooms.
- Spectators who wish to sit but will not wear a mask should bring their own chairs.

- Spectators who do not wear masks should maintain social distancing per public health guidelines.
- We will attempt to livestream home games if technology permits.
 - Search YouTube for 'Mead Public Schools' or use this link.
- Admission payments in exact amounts are preferred to eliminate the need to provide change.
- Students and children will not be permitted to play sideline football or other sideline games that place them at risk for exposure to COVID-19.
- Concessions will be available, but if removal of a mask is necessary, concessions should be consumed outside of the bleachers.
- Cheerleaders are allowed but must social distance outside of the team box and within the roped off area away from spectators. No visiting bands allowed.
- Players will proceed directly to locker rooms or designated areas after games are completed.

Syracuse JV VB Tournament Covid Procedures

- Family Members of players and coaches ONLY.
- (Masks and Social Distancing Required) Families will be

encouraged to sit in household groups. No loitering in the building.

• Concessions: Will be available but may be discontinued without notice.


