On Thursday afternoon, Cameron Morrison, admissions counselor came to speak with interested students about Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville, MO.

Established in 1905, Northwest Missouri State University is a state-assisted, comprehensive four-year regional university that also offers a broad range of undergraduate and selected graduate programs on its Maryville campus. Northwest offers 127 undergraduate programs and 40 graduate's programs. Career Services offers an "Exploring Majors" fair where students may learn about different majors and find a major that is the perfect fit for them.

Every full-time student receives a laptop computer to use throughout the school year. Northwest offers a textbook rental program through which students pay just \$6 per credit hour for their textbooks and save thousands of dollars when compared to peers at other institutions.



Northwest advocates for profession-based experience in every area of study. At Northwest's Horace Mann Laboratory School, students majoring in education begin observing and practicing in the teaching profession immediately.

Other profession-based experiences include work at Northwest's R.T. Wright Farm, radio and television stations, and a variety of internships.

Northwest has about 7,800 students. This size of campus offers opportunities for students to succeed socially as well as academically. With a student to teacher ratio of 20 to 1, you never feel like a number and receive personalized attention from faculty.
