Fall Preschool Enrollment 2022-23

Little Panther Preschool is currently taking registrations for children who are interested in preschool. Please call the office to place your child's name on the list.

Preschool Enrollment Policy

Our enrollment procedure used to determine the preschool class list each spring is based on the following list of criteria in order of priority:

- Students on an Individualized Education Program (IEP), living in our school district will have first priority for acceptance. The State of Nebraska set up the preschool program to help those children with the highest needs.
- 2. Those students living in our school district who will turn four by July 31st, oldest to youngest by birth month/day/year.
- Those students living in our school district who will turn three by July 31st, oldest to youngest by birth month/day/year.
- 4. If there are still open spots, nondistrict students will be chosen based on the criteria listed above.

A quality early childhood program keeps the teacher/student ratio low, and matches enrollment to the physical size of the facility. Those two factors are a factor in our enrollment numbers and have to be taken into account when determining class lists. Thank you for your understanding.


Kansas, and feature several testimonials from past and current TeamMates matches.

Susan T. Buffett Scholarship

The Susan T. Buffett Foundation has offered scholarships to college students in Nebraska for over 50 years. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to first-time freshman entering college who live in Nebraska, graduate from a Nebraska high school (or GED) with plans to attend a Nebraska public college, and demonstrate financial need. There are a limited number of scholarships, so the Foundation is unable to provide awards to all eligible candidates. For more info go to: https://buffettscholarships.org/



To be eligible for the Susan T. Buffett scholarship, you must:

- Live in Nebraska and meet in-state residency requirements of the college you plan to attend
 - DACA, undocumented, or DACA eligible students are still eligible to apply
 - For questions about your residency status, here is a <u>list of</u> contact numbers
- Graduate from a Nebraska high school or earn a Nebraska GED
- Achieve at least a 2.0 cumulative unweighted GPA in high school

- o 2.0 on a 4 point scale
- o 77 on a 100 point scale
- Be a first-time freshman when entering college
 - Students obtaining dual enrollment credits in high school are still eligible to apply
- Plan to attend a Nebraska public college:
 - NE Community Colleges CCC, LPTC, MCC, MPCC, NECC, NICC, SCC, or WNCC;
 - NE State College System Chadron State, Peru State, Wayne State; or
 - University of NE System NCTA, UNK, UNL, UNMC, or UNO
- Be in need of financial assistance in order to attend college
 - Note: You do not need to be Pell Grant eligible to qualify
 - You must have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) below \$10,000

All eligible applications are reviewed and scored. Selection is based on:

- Financial need
- Academic merit
- Personal essay
 - Recommendation
