School Closing Due to Inclement Weather

Each winter we have school days when we are faced with the dilemma as to whether school will start on time, start late, or should be canceled altogether. These are the primary contacts with late start or closing information. In addition, we will notify channel 10-11 television for the Lincoln market and Channel 6 television in the Omaha market. Guess Who?: Mineral Edition

The past few weeks' freshmen science students have been working in earth science. The have made it through volcanoes, tectonic plates, earthquakes, the atmosphere, weather, minerals, rocks, and are currently on weathering and erosion. This year we incorporated out some of our vocabulary words into game. Students used those terms in order to identify the mineral that their

partner chose. Students had to use clues like metallic/nonmetallic, hardness, cleavage, fracture, colors, streak, characteristics, composition, and what the mineral is apart of. Most of us have played the game Guess Who. Rather than physical features of humans, they used physical properties of mineral to narrow down their choices to one. They were only able to ask five questions and three guesses regarding their partner's mineral, so they had to be particular on which questions they asked about their partners mineral. If anyone wanted to see some competition, well this game brought out that

competitive spirit in the freshmen as they were trying to use fewer questions and fewer guesses than their partner did. I had to remind some competitive students that this to help with learning about minerals not necessarily being first. We were able to use our vocabulary words but we also had some fun while doing it. We also discussed about using everyday skills like problemsolving, good questioning techniques, memory, and attention to detail to play our Guess Who?: Mineral Edition game. The best part was seeing the interactions amongst the students because it brought out a social side in everyone.
