Principal's Update

We ask that families attending the K–2 concert exit the gym before guests for the 3rd and 4th grade concert enter to help with smooth transitions. **There is no formal dress code. Holiday colors are encouraged if your student would like to participate.**

Shelter Drill

On Monday, November 17, we conducted our first shelter drill of the school year as part of our commitment to student safety. As an I Love U Guys school, we follow the Standard Response Protocol, which uses clear, consistent language to guide students



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and staff through different safety situations. Before the drill, teachers talked with students about what a shelter drill is, why we practice it, and how we respond in a calm and age-appropriate way. Our goal with every drill is to help students feel prepared and confident. Thank you for your continued partnership in keeping our school community safe. Winter Weather Clothing

As we transition from fall to winter weather, please help your child come to school prepared for the day's temperatures. Students go outside for recess as long as the weather allows, so be sure they have appropriate jackets, hats, and gloves when needed. Guidance for jackets and recess wear as well as indoor recess can be found below. We strongly recommend labeling your child's jackets and coats with their name. This helps ensure that their items are returned to them instead of sitting unclaimed in the lost and found. Our lost and found is located by the entryway. Please take a moment to visit the lost and found if your child is missing any items.

Dismissal Changes

Coordinating the dismissal plans for 350 students each day is extremely challenging and time consuming for the office staff. If you have a change request, we ask that these are communicated to the office by 2:00 each day. Ideally, the transportation plan is consistent day to day. We understand that some days a change is needed. However, receiving these requests within an hour of dismissal is a challenge for ensuring timely communication to staff to ensure these students get to where they need to go. Please assist in helping make this process smooth and effective.

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Bus Changes

Due to limited bus drivers and seating, we are unable to support students riding to a friend's house. Students can be bused home according to their regular route, and we are unable to provide transportation to other locations. We will continue to have daily shuttles from the elementary school and high school. Thank you for understanding.

Arrival Procedures

Students in the Rec Program may be dropped off starting at 7:00. All other students should arrive no earlier than 7:50 unless they are riding the bus or attending the Rec Program. The front doors will open at 7:50, and staff will begin monitoring the drop-off line at that time. Students dropped off before 7:50 will be unsupervised and the doors will be locked. Breakfast will be served from 7:50 to 8:20 daily. During arrival, students will gather in the Bennet Commons until 8:20 and then be escorted to classrooms. The school day starts at 8:20, and the tardy bell rings at 8:25.

If you are dropping a student off to ride the morning bus shuttles to PHS and have elementary students with them, we cannot provide supervision for students prior to 7:30. Please have students wait in the car until this time as the buses do not arrive until 7:30.

Parent Drop Off and Pickup Procedures

A few reminders that I would like to share to help everyone get in and out quickly:

- Please have students enter and exit your vehicle on the passenger side of your vehicle. The drop off lane is extremely effective and the safety of your student is our top priority. By doing this, we can ensure that students are not in zones of traffic and are not in harm's way.
- If you are using the parent drop/pick up lanes, please stay in your vehicles. If you would like to park and walk up, please utilize the parking spaces in the interior of the parent pickup/dropoff lane.
- In the afternoon **only**, Kindergarten parents may utilize the bus drop off lane for pickup for Kindergarten students and older siblings. Grades 1-5 will continue to use the primary pickup/dropoff lane. Teachers have now been assigned zones to help aid in the location of your students to help you get in and out quickly.

This week, students in Kindergarten and First Grade focused on kindness. Through listening to the book "Chrysanthemum" by Kevin Hanks, students were able to discuss kind and hurtful actions and words and identify how these impact ourselves and others.

Students then participated in the wrinkled heart activity. They were able to wrinkle the hearts on their papers when unkind words or action examples were heard or seen. When something kind was said or done, students unwrinkled their hearts. A discussion was had on how we must always think "is it kind?" "is it true?" and "is it helpful?" prior to saying or doing something as we can never take back our actions and words.

Library

Our students are really enjoying the updated library space! One of their favorite parts of class is spending the last ten minutes relaxing and reading in our new comfortable seating area. A big thank-you to everyone who helped make the Bennet Fun Run such a huge success — your support helps us continue to grow and update our collection. Mr. Smidt has started ordering new books!

In second grade, students spent the first quarter reviewing the parts of a book and learning about the white spine labels that help every book find its special place on the shelf. They also explored the difference between fiction and nonfiction. Coming up, students will learn what the letters E, FIC, and the numbers on book spines mean — and how they help us locate books quickly.

In third grade, students reviewed how to use a table of contents and practiced organizing stacks of nonfiction books in the correct order during class activities. Our current focus is on dictionary skills, including guide words, base words, and parts of speech.

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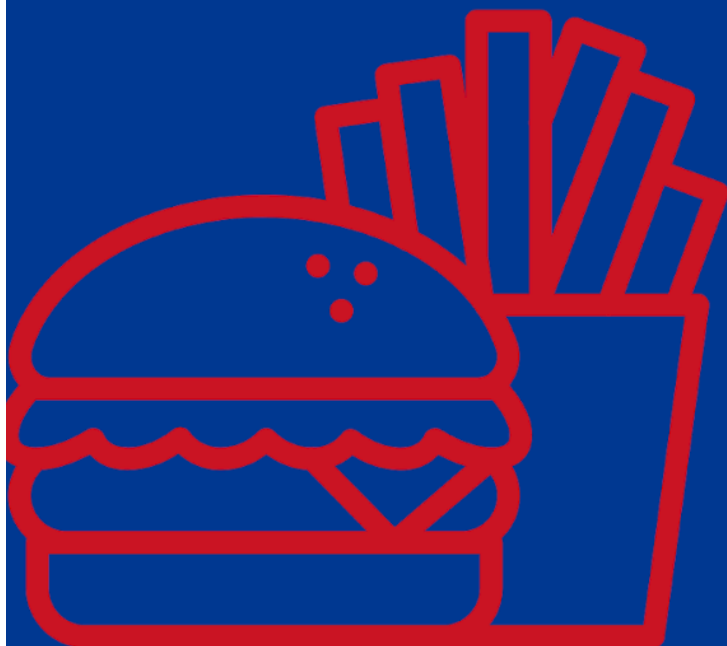

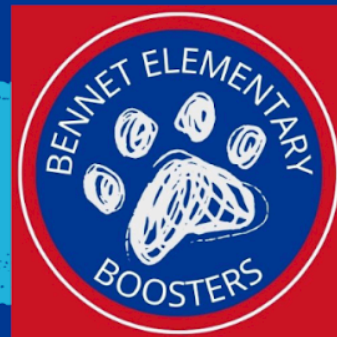

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Standard Response Protocol

Bennet Elementary's adoption of the Standard Response Protocol (SRP) provides a standardized approach to managing various events, both threatening and non-threatening, that may happen in or around our school.

These protocols provide actions for the following situations:

- Hold (stay in classrooms due to a non-threatening event)
- Secure (danger is outside the school)
- Lockdown (danger is inside the school)
- Evacuate (leave the school building, often referred to as fire drill)
- Shelter (tornado or severe weather)

IN AN EMERGENCY TAKE ACTION



HOLD! In your room or area. Clear the halls.

STUDENTS

Clear the hallways and remain in room or area until the "All Clear" is announced
Do business as usual

ADULTS

Close and lock the door
Account for students and adults
Do business as usual



SECURE! Get inside. Lock outside doors.

STUDENTS

Return to inside of building
Do business as usual

TEACHERS

Bring everyone indoors
Lock outside doors
Increase situational awareness
Do business as usual
Take attendance



LOCKDOWN! Locks, lights, out of sight.

STUDENTS

Move away from sight
Maintain silence
Do not open the door

ADULTS

Recover students from hallway if possible
Lock the classroom door
Turn out the lights
Move away from sight
Maintain silence
Do not open the door
Prepare to evade or defend



EVACUATE! (A location may be specified)

STUDENTS

Leave stuff behind if required to
If possible, bring your phone
Follow instructions

ADULTS

Lead students to Evacuation location
Account for students and adults
Notify if missing, extra or injured students or adults



SHELTER! Hazard and safety strategy.

STUDENTS

Use appropriate safety strategy for the hazard

Tornado
Hazmat
Earthquake
Tsunami

Safety Strategy

Evacuate to shelter area
Seal the room
Drop, cover and hold
Get to high ground

ADULTS

Lead safety strategy
Account for students and adults
Notify if missing, extra or injured students or adults
